1 June 2021, Cornwall - The word Anthem ($\bar{a}n'tham$) is defined as a hymn of praise or a rock or popular song felt to sum up the attitudes or feelings associated with a period or social group. Anthem is also the name of an exhibition presenting the work of four inspiring artists, at Tremenheere Gallery, Friday 17 September to Saturday 9 October 2021, 11am-4pm. The opening of the exhibition will take place on Thursday 16 September, 6pm8pm.

Through the diverse media of sculpture, pottery, mixed media and oil paint, Masoud Akhavanjam, Julia Florence, Danny Romeril and Marion Taylor's art and art practices are drawn together in a lyrical exploration of this particular moment in time.

Masoud Akhavanjam is an Iranian sculptor working in mirror polished stainless steel and bronze. His sculptures balance the inherent strength of the materials with the delicacies of the cast form.

Julia Florence is a ceramicist, who trained in Illustration at Falmouth University and drawing at the Charles H. Cecil Studios in Florence, Italy, before discovering ceramics. She lives and works in Cornwall.

Danny Romeril studied Fine Art at Central St Martins College in London. He has taken part in solo and group exhibitions in his native Jersey, in Australia, Germany and in London, where he lives and works.

Marion Taylor's series "That's how the light gets in" is inspired by Leonard Cohen's song, Anthem. The series is about the contrasts of light and dark and the resilience of the human spirit. According to Marion, "Cohen's words went straight to the essence of these emotions."
